Kiribati Participates in the 4th PNA Leaders' Summit in Tuvalu





Leaders of the Parties to the Nauru Agreement (PNA) comprising FSM, Kiribati, RMI, Nauru, Palau, PNG, Solomon Islands, Tuvalu, and Tokelau, met in Funafuti, Tuvalu, from 1–5 September 2025 for their 4th PNA Leaders' Summit under the theme "Our Shared Path to Sustainable Development and Full Control of Tuna Fisheries." The meeting focused on strategies to maximize economic benefits from the region's tuna resources, which, though the world's largest and healthiest, continue to yield limited returns for PNA countries.

The Government of Kiribati through Ministry of Fisheries and Ocean Resources, the Office of Te Beretitenti, and Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Immigration expressed appreciation to the Tuvalu Fisheries Authority and the people of Tuvalu for their warm hospitality and excellent organization of a successful summit.

The 54th Pacific Islands Forum Leaders' Meeting (PIFLM54) was held in Honiara, Solomon Islands, from 8 to 12 September 2025, under the theme "Iumi Together: Act Now for an Integrated Blue Pacific Continent." The meeting brought together leaders from across the Pacific to discuss urgent regional priorities, including climate change, sustainable development, digital transformation, and regional security.

UNGA80: Kiribati demonstrates leadership at the 80th Session of the United Nations General Assesmbly.

NEW YORK, 24-26 September 2025, The Government of the Republic of Kiribati showcased decisive leadership at UNGA80, advancing national priorities on resilience, sustainable development, health, youth, oceans, and regional solidarity. Led by **H.E. Te Beretitenti Taneti Maamau**, the delegation engaged in the General Debate and high-level meetings convened by the President of the General Assembly and the UN Secretary-General.

In his national statement, Te Beretitenti reaffirmed Kiribati's commitment to multilateralism and called for a United Nations that delivers tangible results for small island developing states (SIDS) backing the Secretary-General's UN80 reform agenda, fairer access to finance through a Multidimensional Vulnerability Index, and concrete outcomes at the Financing for Development conference. He underscored Kiribati's peace and security posture including support for the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons and a nuclear-free ocean alongside governance reforms strengthening services across outer islands

The high-level delegation comprised the Honourable Vice President Dr Teuea Toatu, the Honourable Minister for Health and Medical Services (MHMS) Booti Nauan, and the Honourable Minister for Women, Youth, Sports and Social Affairs (MWYSSA) Ruth Kwansing.

Across all engagements, Kiribati called for accessible, predictable financing that matches SIDS realities and drives a wealthier, healthier, and more peaceful future for all I-Kiribati. E oti ana botumwaaka te I-Kiribati - Kiribati delivered on its mission.



Geneva, Switzerland: The Official Opening of The Kiribati Diplomatic Mission

On 29th September 2025, the Republic of Kiribati marked a historic diplomatic milestone with the official opening of its Permanent Mission to the United Nations Office and other International Organizations in Geneva.



The inauguration ceremony was officiated by His Excellency Te Beretitenti Taneti Maamau, followed by a dinner reception, in the presence of distinguished guests, dignitaries, and international partners, reaffirming Kiribati's commitment to active multilateral engagement and global cooperation.







In his keynote address, President Maamau emphasized the significance of this new diplomatic mission for the country:

"Resilience and adaptation lie at the heart of our response. Through this Mission, Kiribati will engage with many organizations headquartered in Geneva from those advancing human rights and thosehumanitarian action, to leading work on trade, health, labor, and the environment to champion initiatives that strengthen our safeguard communities, our environment, and empower people to thrive despite adversity."

The event was attended by representatives from fellow Pacific Island Missions in Geneva, including Australia, New Zealand, the Commonwealth Secretariat, and the Government of Switzerland. Their presence underscored the strong bonds of regional solidarity and shared global priorities among small island states and their partners.

Also present were high-level officials from the United Nations, UN agencies, and members of the I-Kiribati diaspora in Switzerland. The gathering reflected broad international support for Kiribati's enhanced presence in Geneva and its active role in multilateral forums, including the World Health Organization (WHO), the Human Rights Council (HRC), the International Labour Organization (ILO), and other key institutions based in Geneva.

Kiribati's Permanent Mission will play a critical role in advancing the country's foreign policy objectives, especially in areas such as climate change, sustainable development, health, and human rights to name a few, while strengthening partnerships with the international community.

The Government of Kiribati expresses its sincere gratitude to the Swiss Confederation, partner countries, and international organizations that have supported the establishment of the Mission.






